| | Hiking, trekking and mountaineering | On recommended trails. Prohibited in maximum preservation zones. |
| | Whitewater canoeing, kayaking and rafting | On recommended routes. Verify if this activity is possible according to high- and low-water season conditions. |
| | Camping | Fees applicable. Pack out all waste. Prioritize designated sites or where there is no vegetation. Prohibited in maximum preservation zones. |
| | Sport Fishing | June 1st to September 7th, 2018 (see document on sport fishing regulation) Permits required: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Québec Provincial Sport Fishing Licence • Landholding Authorization Permit where applicable • Park Sport Fishing Authorization Prohibited in preservation and maximum preservation zones. Not authorized downriver from the Qurlutuarjuq falls. Catches must be consumed in the park. Only one catch may be packed out. |
| | Skiing and snowshoeing | On recommended trails. Prohibited in maximum preservation zones. |
| | Dogsledding | On recommended trails. Prohibited in maximum preservation zones. Dog teams must be tied up at least 70 meters from water bodies. |
| | Swimming | Unsupervised activity, swimming at your own risk. |
| | Rock climbing | Only with prior authorization by the park according to experiences and technical skills of visitors. Prohibited in maximum preservation zones. |
| | Gathering | Edible plants for non-commercial purposes only. Prohibited in preservation and maximum preservation zones. |
| | Fire | At the service camp in indicated areas. On the sand banks of the Koroc River with driftwood. |

- Any person who travels, stays or engages in an activity in the park must comply with the activities and conditions listed above. For all other activities, visitors must obtain the prior written authorization of the park director.
- To practice any other activities not mentioned above, visitors must obtain beforehand a written authorization of the park director.
- Available activities depend on the weather and field conditions.
- All activities in the park must comply with the principles of Leave No Trace Canada: www.leavenotrace.ca

MOTORIZED TRANSPORTATION TO ACCESS THE PARK MANDATORY AUTHORIZATION

| Aircraft | Only Twin Otter aircrafts, floatplanes and helicopters are authorized to land within the boundaries of Parc national Kuururjuaq. Authorization by the park director required to land in the park. Landing prohibited in natural environment, preservation and maximum preservation zones. Only allowed in service zones. According to the Aeronautical Information Publication, overflights of national parks should not be conducted below 2,000 feet AGL (above ground level). |
| Snowmobile | Authorization required by the park director to operate a snowmobile in Parc national Kuururjuaq. Snowmobile operation prohibited in preservation and maximum preservation zones. Snowmobile operation to travel from one location to another is permitted. Otherwise, snowmobile is not an authorized recreational activity. |
