2018 AUTHORIZED ACTIVITIES

REGISTRATION IS MANDATORY PRIOR TO ENGAGING IN ANY ACTIVITY IN THE PARK BY
FILLING THE FORM AVAILABLE AT THE PARK'S OFFICE OR AT www.nunavikparks.ca

	Hiking and trekking	On recommended trails. Prohibited in maximum preservation zones.
	Whitewater canoeing, kayaking and rafting	On recommended routes. Verify if this activity is possible according to high- and low-water season conditions.
	Camping	Fees applicable. Pack out all waste. Prioritize designated sites or where there is no vegetation. Prohibited in maximum preservation zones.
	Sport Fishing	June 1st to September 7th, 2018 (see the document on sport fishing regulation) Permits required: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Québec Provincial Sport Fishing Licence • Landholding Authorization Permit where applicable • Park Sport Fishing Authorization • Outfitters registration for Atlantic salmon sport fishing and for activities in their territories of operation Prohibited in preservation and maximum preservation zones. Catches must be consumed in the park. Only one catch may be packed out atlantic salmon excepted.
	Skiing and snowshoeing	On recommended trails. Prohibited in maximum preservation zones.
	Dogsledding	On recommended trails. Prohibited in maximum preservation zones. Dog teams must be tied up at least 70 meters from water bodies.
	Swimming	Unsupervised activity, swimming at your own risk.
	Gathering	Edible plants for non-commercial purposes only. Prohibited in preservation and maximum preservation zones.
	Fire	On the sand banks of rivers with driftwood.

- Any person who travels, stays or engages in an activity in the park must comply with the activities and conditions listed above. For all other activities, visitors must obtain the prior written authorization of the park director.
- To practice any other activities not mentioned above, visitors must obtain beforehand a written authorization of the park director.
- Available activities depend on the weather and field conditions.
- All activities in the park must comply with the principles of Leave No Trace Canada: www.leavenotrace.ca

MOTORIZED TRANSPORTATION TO ACCESS THE PARK MANDATORY AUTHORIZATION

Aircraft	Only Twin Otter aircrafts, floatplanes and helicopters are authorized to land within the boundaries of Parc national Ulittaniujalik. Authorization by the park director required to land in the park. Landing prohibited in natural environment, preservation and maximum preservation zones. Only allowed in service zones. According to the Aeronautical Information Publication, overflights of national parks should not be conducted below 2,000 feet AGL (above ground level).
Snowmobile	Authorization required by the park director to operate a snowmobile in Parc national Ulittaniujalik. Snowmobile operation prohibited in preservation and maximum preservation zones. Snowmobile operation to travel from one location to another is permitted. Otherwise, snowmobile is not an authorized recreational activity.

Pursuant to Section 24 of the JBNQA, Beneficiaries retain their right to practise traditional activities in accordance with said regime. Regulations in force in Québec's national parks in Nunavik regarding hunting, firearms, trapping, snowmobile, fire, wood cutting and pets are not applicable to them as the case may be. Moreover, Naskapi beneficiaries can exercise their right to harvest in accordance with the regime for the caribou zone which is located in part within the park boundaries.
