AUTHORIZED ACTIVITIES

REGISTRATION IS MANDATORY PRIOR TO ENGAGING IN ANY ACTIVITY IN THE PARK BY FILLING THE FORM AVAILABLE AT THE OFFICE OR AT www.nunavikparks.ca

	Hiking, trekking	Prohibited in maximum preservation zones.
	Whitewater canoeing, kayaking and rafting	Verify if this activity is possible according to high- and low-water season conditions.
	Camping	Fees applicable. Pack out all waste. At designated sites or where there is no vegetation. At the mouth of Nastapoka river, it is possible to camp only on the north bank. Prohibited in maximum preservation zones.
	Fishing	From June 1st to September 7th See document for fishing regulation on this site: www.nunavikparks.ca Permits required: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Provincial sport fishing licence • Park fishing authorization • Might also be needed: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Landholding Corporation(s) licence in order to fish in category II lands. - The Sport fishing licence for Atlantic salmon in order to keep this species. Prohibited in preservation and maximum preservation zones. Catches must be consumed in the park; only one fish may be packed out.
	Boating	Authorized on Tasiujaq Lake and sectors of Hudson Bay included in the park
	Skiing and snowshoeing	Prohibited in maximum preservation zones.
	Dogsledding	Prohibited in maximum preservation zones. Dog teams must be tied up at least 70 meters from water bodies.
	Swimming	Unsupervised activity; swimming at your own risk.
	Gathering	Edible plants for non-commercial purposes only. Prohibited in preservation and maximum preservation zones.
	Fire	Accepted only at those sites: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • On sandy banks of the Nastapoka river with driftwood. • On the north bank of the mouth of the Nastapoka River. • On designated areas on Tasiujaq Lake.
	Dogs	Dogs are authorized only on Tasiujaq lake when leashed.

- Any person who travels, stays or engages in an activity in the park must comply with the activities and conditions listed above. For all other activities, visitors must obtain a prior written authorization of the park director.
- Available activities depend on the weather and field conditions.
- All activities in the park must comply with the Leave No Trace Canada principles found at leavenotrace.ca

MOTORIZED TRANSPORTATION TO ACCESS THE PARK MANDATORY AUTHORIZATION

Aircraft	Authorization by the park director required to land in the Parc national Tursujuq. It is prohibited to fly-over the park below 2,000 feet AGL (above ground level).
Snowmobile	Autonomous snowmobile operation authorized only on Tasiujaq Lake and at the mouth of Nastapoka river, downstream of waterfall. It is mandatory to get an authorization by park director to operate a snowmobile elsewhere in the park. Snowmobile operation prohibited in preservation and maximum preservation zones. Snowmobile operation to travel from one place to another is permitted. Otherwise, snowmobile is not an authorized recreational activity.
